VETERANS DAY MASS

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 12
AT 12:00 NOON

The origins of Veterans Day are rooted in the celebration of what was once known as Armistice Day. President Woodrow Wilson first proclaimed Armistice Day for November 11, 1919, exactly one year after the end of the first World War. In proclaiming the holiday he said, "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations."

The holiday is observed specifically on November 11th to signify the end of the major hostilities of World War I, which officially ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. An Act approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November each year a legal holiday- a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as Armistice Day. At the urging of veterans service organizations, the Act of 1938 was amended in 1954 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans," representing a day to honor American veterans of all wars. President Dwight D. Eisenhower issued the first Veterans Day Proclamation on October 8, 1954.

The observance of this federal holiday is honored with celebrations of all sorts. Cities and towns across our country honor our dedicated service men and women with parades, special services, and firework displays. Each special celebration is held to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good. Here in our own parish, Our Lady of Mercy shows honor to our veterans with a special Mass dedicated to all who have served. At this beautiful patriotic liturgy we will recognize all five branches of the military- **Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, and Coast Guard**. The celebration wouldn't be complete without patriotic songs such as the *Battle Hymn of the Republic* and the *Armed Forces Medley*.

We ask for your prayers for all members of the armed forces, especially those who are serving from our parish. **OUR VETERANS DAY CELEBRATION WILL TAKE PLACE AT THE NOON MASS ON SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 12.** The parish community of Our Lady of Mercy extends its most sincere gratitude to Mr. Jim Williams for coordinating this beautiful celebration. We hope you will join us in honoring all who have served. God Bless America!

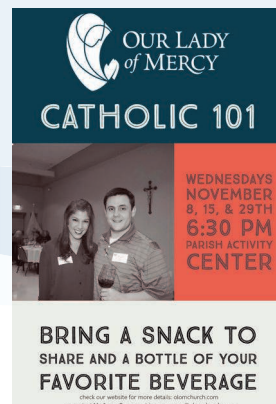

Mercy Prepares for Columbarium Garden of Peace

Parishioners will remember that during the period of Master Planning for our future, along with the priorities of new and expanding classrooms for our growing school and a desperately needed new gym, there was a strong interest in a Columbarium Garden for the inurnment of cremains. This project has been in the preparatory stage for quite some time and Our Lady of Mercy will soon begin offering columbarium spaces. In the next few weeks, a lunch and learn will be announced to speak specifically about our proposed Columbarium Garden. We will answer questions regarding pricing, location, figuration of the garden, and clarify any issues concerning Church teachings on cremation.

In the early years of the Church, during periods of persecution, the bodies of Christians were burned as an insult to the Christian belief of the resurrection of the body. For this reason, the Church for many centuries did not allow cremation since it was associated with disrespect and mockery of belief in the resurrection. Centuries later, this is no longer the case and people today no longer associate cremation with those ideas.

In May 1963, the Vatican Congregation of the Doctrine of Faith lifted the prohibition forbidding Catholics to choose cremation. This permission to be cremated was incorporated into the revised Code of Canon Law of 1983 (Canon No. 1176) as well as into the Order of Christian Funerals. The Bishops of the United States and the Holy See have authorized the celebration of a Catholic funeral liturgy with the cremated remains present. The Church does not prohibit cremation.

In 1977, the bishops of the United States published a booklet called *Reflections on the Body, Cremation, and Catholic Funeral Rites* that presents pastoral guidelines for Catholics who choose cremation. In part the U.S. bishops say:

“The remains of cremated bodies should be treated with the same respect given to the corporal remains of a human body. This includes the manner in which they are carried, the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and their final disposition. The cremated remains of a body should be entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium; they may also be buried in a common grave in a cemetery. The practices of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground or keeping cremated remains on the home of a relative or friend of the deceased are not the reverent disposition that the Church requires.”

A common practice is the entombment of the cremated remains in a “columbarium.” It is an arrangement of niches, either in a mausoleum, a room, or wall into which an urn or other worthy vessel is placed for permanent memorial.

The Mercy Columbarium will be known as the Garden of Peace. Please watch your bulletin for more details coming soon.

OLOM CONFERENCE

Our St. Vincent de Paul Conference has completed another year—its fiscal year ended September 30—and it's been a busy one. First, in fulfillment of our mission to provide emergency help to our less fortunate neighbors, during the past year our members made 475 home visits helping 1093 people. These visits were made possible only through the generosity of our parishioners and allowed our members to provide food when the cupboard was bare, keep the lights on so children could do their homework, provide rental assistance, and even help some families avoid the trauma of an eviction.

Also, the Conference provided disaster relief to numerous families whose homes were flooded in August 2016. Most of the monies disbursed (\$42,400) were from Conference funds—we also distributed \$13,000 which we received from other sources.

All of this was possible because of the very generous support we have received from parishioners throughout the year. We thank you and look forward to your continued support.
