SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John of Capistrano (1386-1456)

FEAST DAY: October 23

St. John of Capistrano was a traveling Franciscan priest who evangelized throughout Italy, Germany, Austria, Hungary, Poland and Russia. Well-educated and born to a German knight, this Italian young man studied law in Perugia and practiced in Naples. He was appointed Governor and defended the town against a neighboring village. He was imprisoned during the war. Upon release, he entered the Franciscan community at Perugia, but immediately began traveling and establishing more communities of Franciscan renewal.

At the age of 70, he led a great crusade to defend Rome and Vienna from the Turks in the 15th century. A brilliant homilist, his communication skills likely led to his success as a military leader of more than 70,000 Christian crusaders.

As a reformer of the Franciscan Order and a travelling preacher, St. John of Capistrano teaches us to be prompt and zealous in promoting and upholding spiritual values.

Prayer: Lord, you raised up St. John of Capistrano to give your people comfort in their trials. May your Church enjoy unending peace and be secure in your protection.
