NINETEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME DAILY PRAYER THIS WEEK

Finding intimacy with our God is not limited to people who can go away on a retreat. We can all be contemplatives in action, if only we can focus on our relationship with the Lord in the background, every day. This week we can feed on the words of life which Jesus gives us. And, we can ask for the graces we need, in the midst of our busy lives.

Throughout this week, we can wake up and go through our morning routine asking for the grace that God's mercy might flow through us this day. One day, I might take notice of those in my life who need my forgiveness. I might pay attention to the one who frustrates me or has hurt me or has hurt those I love - real people I know (living or dead) or the anonymous people who represent the systems, institutions and structures that seem unjust or sinful. There are people who benefit from war, the poverty or slavery of others, the sacrilege against the dignity of life itself, the drug trade and the destruction of the environment. I can actually take the grace filled moments of brief intimacy with Jesus this week to forgive! This week of mercy can be a powerful blessing for our whole lives.

This can be a wonderful week for us to remember how many times we are called to forgive. And, we might want to take a few extra moments to reinforce this by re-reading the parable of the servant who has been forgiven himself but refuses to forgive. If we are really stuck in our struggle to forgive, we can find times to beg for the grace: "Dear Lord, you keep forgiving me, please let me experience the intimacy of forgiving as you have forgiven me."

Throughout this week, we'll be embracing little children and other "little ones" because we will be delighting in being one with him and his being one with us. And, we'll give thanks and praise.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

REFECTION BY: DEACON KIRK DUPLANTIS

Recently I had the privilege of attending the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana, the first of its kind in 83 years. Over 50,000 men, women, and children attended this event to gain a better understanding and worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

What a beautiful experience it was to see so many Catholics worshiping Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament in such an extraordinary way. There were hundreds of religious, priests, deacons, seminarians, and bishops in attendance, along with many great speakers such as Fr. Mike Schmitz, Bishop Robert Barron, and Johnathon Roumie of "The Chosen." There were many speeches we attended, as well




as displays and presentations including relics of many Blesseds and Saints, such as Blessed Carlos Acutis, Fr. Michael J. McGivney, Saint Manuel Gonzales "the bishop of the abandoned tabernacle," and Juan Diego, the patron saint of the Eucharistic pilgrimage that came through the streets of Baton Rouge.

While there, I again recognized how often we take the Eucharist for granted. Yes, we may attend Mass, the most perfect form of worship in the church, but do we have the desire in our hearts to proclaim this to the world? Do we only keep this for our own personal spiritual benefit and not share it with others? On Saturday night of the congress, Bishop Robert Barron said something that inspired all present. He told the crowd that he was inspired to be witnessing 60,000 people who are fired up for Jesus in the Eucharist. He also taught that it is our obligation to continue to proclaim the Gospel of the Eucharist, the excitement it brings to our hearts, and the desire it brings to our souls to every person we encounter. This is something I believe will change many lives. Bishop Barron also said, "imagine if the 70 million Catholics in the United Sates had this same vigor, how we could change the world." As an ordained deacon of this parish, I have a specific obligation to promote belief in the True Presence, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, but all laity have one too. This means that we must have a renewed spirit, an understanding of the importance of the Holy Eucharist, and be willing to publicly proclaim the truth of our faith. If we did this, can you imagine what we can do for the world around us here at Mercy?

The major themes of the congress were acknowledging our sinfulness, being repentant people, and our hunger for Eucharist. To satisfy our hunger for the Eucharist we must first be repentant people. The congress emphasized the bread of life discourse in the Gospel of John and how these words from scripture form the basis for the truth of the Eucharist. This event really gave me a renewed perspective on Eucharistic presence in my life as a deacon, father, husband, and as a child of God. I hope to continue to share this with you, my friends and that you may also have a renewed Eucharistic life.

Come Down to the River!

The Tenth Annual Eucharistic Boat Procession, born on the Bayou, this year will jump ship to the River! The solemn flotilla will embark on the Mighty Mississippi for a one-time only Blessing of the River and the Great State of Lousiana! Noone should miss this once-in-a-lifetime cultural and religious event! Families, businesses and churches are encouraged to "come down to the river" and participate in the two-day blessing. The extraordinary procession will begin on Wednesday, August 14 at 8 AM with a Votive Mass of the Holy Eucharist by Bishop Michael Duca, D.D. at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Baton Rouge. Following the Mass there will be a procession



with the Blessed Sacrament to the Mississippi River where the 130-mile procession and blessing will commence. At 10:30 AM the flotilla will depart. The boat procession will pass Plaquemine at about 12:35 PM and Donaldsonville at approximately 3:50 PM. The flotilla is slated to arrive at Convent, LA at about 5:40 PM where there will be a procession to the historic St. Michael Church for all-night adoration. On Thursday, August 15 at 8:45 AM there will be a procession from St. Michael's back to the river dock and at 10:00 AM the boats will depart for New Orleans. The procession will pass Reserve at about 12:00 PM, Luling at about 1:40 PM, and Audubon Park at about 3:40 PM. Families, parishes, and pilgrims are encouraged to gather at these revival sites along the river for prayer and reception of the blessing. The flotilla will arrive at about 4:25 PM in the French Quarter and there will be a Great Benediction on the levee at 5:15 PM in front of Jackson Square, followed by a procession into St. Louis Cathedral for a final blessing and a Solemn Mass of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary by Archbishop Gregory Aymond, D.D. The 2-day festivities will conclude with a celebration in Jackson Square at 7:30 PM. All are encouraged to "Come Down to the River" for this historic event!
